This year we are using a new programme to teach the children about the Equalities Act. This is part of the PSHE curriculum and will be taught through story books, pictures and discussions in classes and assembly. We will teach children that it's OK to be different, to be able to work with others and to welcome and respect everyone, regardless of their differences.

We have already started using some of the resources and the children have really enjoyed the stories and understand the concept of nobody being an 'outsider' in our school and our community.



### Creativity and PTFA

Over the past few years the money that you have all raised as part of the PTFA has gone towards supporting creative opportunities for all your children. ## GST Poppies and Poems Week



During the week of November 5<sup>th</sup>, each school across the Gosforth Schools' Trust will be taking part in Poppies and Poem Week as a recognition of the centenary of the end of World War 1 and 100 Years of the RAF. The British Legion's theme of saying 'thank you' will be prevalent during the week as we focus on thinking of the bravery and commitment of others.

At Archibald our week will begin with WW1 Assembly and Performance sessions for Years 1-4.

Year 4 will also be taking part in a theatre workshop at the Alphabetti Theatre and Discovery Museum. Within school, songs such as 'Pack up Your Troubles' and

'It's a long way to Tipperary' will be sang. Year 1 will be focusing on the animals of the war and the roles they played

Each child at Archibald will make a 3D poppy for a grand display in the school hall.

## Important Reminders

### **Drinks in school**

Every classroom has a water cooler and paper cups which all children can access throughout the day.

Water bottles should **not** be brought into school unless there is an explicit medical reason, in which case please come and speak to either Mrs Bayes or Mrs Turner. If there is a specific medical reason which means that the water coolers are not sufficient then only plain, still water must be in the bottles. Juice and flavoured water are not permitted.



### A safe environment for everyone



Please support us in keeping the school a yard a safe environment for everyone. Bikes and scooters should be walked into and out of the yard – not ridden, and ball games are not to take place at the beginning and end of the school day. Our school yard is a very busy place with lots of parents and children and we would like to avoid any accidents.

Please note that dogs, with the exception of guide dogs, are not allowed with the school grounds even if they are carried. If you chose to secure your dog outside the school, please make sure it is away from entrances and not left unattended.

### **Parking**

Thank you to all those parents who continue to 'park and walk'; we appreciate your support in making the roads close to school safer for children and their parents. We do open the doors at 8.45 am to allow you time to find a safe parking place and get into school for start of registration at 8.55 am.

For safeguarding, please do not leave young children unattended in cars - even whilst 'popping' across the road.

Sadly, we have had some complaints from our neighbours regarding cars idling outside residential homes and inconsiderate parking including across driveways blocking residents in.

We have a very good relationship with our neighbours and would like to ask that you take into account their needs when parking near school. Please do not park on the yellow lines or in the alley.



### **Healthy School – Health and Balance Packed lunches**

As a healthy school all meals prepared are balanced. We ask that parents supplying packed lunches from home consider this carefully and provide a balance of savoury and sweet along with fruit. No pop or fizzy drinks should be included. We ask that all sweets / confectionary are kept for treats at home.



### Uniform, coats and names belongings...

The children are all looking exceptionally smart in their uniforms. We are all wearing the correct uniform and shoes. Please continue to support this after half term.

As we are now heading towards the end of Autumn and the beginning of the winter months it is essential that all children have a suitable coat with them every day.

Over the holidays please double check that your child's name is inside each item. We already have a sizeable pile of lost property (3 black bin bags full) which cannot be returned due to being nameless. Remember one red jumper looks exactly the same as another...
