

Literacy

In narrative texts, the children will cover a range of stories with familiar settings, and will have the opportunity to plan and write their own. Non-fiction includes reading and writing different styles of reports and recounts. The children will also complete writing tasks linked to their work on Our Islands; reports, creative stories etc. In speaking and listening, children will take part in drama, role - play and hot -seating activities. They will also have the opportunity to present their work to others, where appropriate, using ICT. Guided Reading and Comprehension sessions will take place each week, children will complete a series of activities and tasks to support with the acquisition and development of reading skills. Regular phonic sessions will also take place to consolidate and embed skills acquired in Key Stage 1.

Numeracy



The children will continue to develop their understanding of place value and partition three digit numbers into multiples of 100, 10 and 1. They will derive and recall all addition and subtraction facts for each number to 20 and look at pairs of number which total 100. Children will be encouraged to add and subtract mentally combinations of one and two digit numbers. They will also be taught different written methods for calculation. They will use Venn and Carroll diagrams to sort data or objects using one or more criterion. All children will have a weekly problem solving session, and in addition, two short sessions that focus on key skills in mathematics. Children will have the opportunity to use a variety of equipment, including ICT, to support their learning.
