

PSHCE To continue our work on No Outsiders we will be reading the book *We're All Wonders*. We will be discussing that everyone has differences and knows what being unique means. Children will learn to understand what a bystander is and how to help. We will explore this during Anti-bullying Week.

Science This half term the children will complete several investigations which will promote the skills of "working like a scientist". We will begin by creating a tornado in a bottle and follow this up by improving our predicting and concluding skills in lots of other experiments.

P.E. We will be creating a dance inspired by some of the extreme weather patterns that we have looked at. Class 7 will continue to go swimming on a weekly basis, building upon the skills they have already learnt. Class 8 will learn a range of invasion games.

RE Year 3's attention will turn to the person of Jesus in the lead up to Christmas. They will learn about Jesus' personality and understand that Jesus was a historical figure but there is no authentic visual image of him.

DT Whilst studying natural disasters in Topic, they will disassemble wind socks to understand their construction. The children will be designing and making windmills and wind turbines, taking inspiration from iconic designs.

Computing The children will use the computers to develop a weather report in groups. They will select, and prepare reports by cropping, resizing editing and importing still and moving images into a multimedia presentation. This will eventually lead up to a recording of a weather report on camera using green screen to show images of the weather.

Spanish The children will continue their weekly Spanish lessons with Senora Linfoot. They will progress through Learning about Spain, the numbers to 20 as well as classroom objects and instructions.



Topic - Geography - This half term the children will learn all about natural disasters and extreme weather patterns. How are tornados formed? Why do people live near volcanoes? How destructive are earthquakes? In addition, many more exciting questions will be answered as children become geographers to find out where in the world these disasters take place.

Art Children will be taking inspiration from the greats. Firstly, we will focus on the work of Hokusai and 'The Great Wave'. We will use his work to master various brush techniques such as using thick and thin brushes to create our own version of his painting. Children will also learn the technique of weaving, starting with paper in order to build up to using wool

Music In music, we will be learning our songs for the Christmas concert. Alongside this, children will continue to play recorders and be able to follow simple notation to produce a tune.
