Literacy

Numeracy

We will start by looking at adding and subtracting fractions, as the children become more secure we will look at equivalent fractions.

We also will revisit the basic operations and consolidate all of the written strategies we use here at Archibald.

The focus will also be on using money and the children will use various strategies for finding change from a given amount. This will provide opportunities to use the column method for £ and pence.

Finally, we will end the year on a Maths trail outside, consolidating all Numeracy skills gained in Year 3!



Science

Children will be planning their own fair tests, testing new ideas and evaluating their own experiments, suggesting ways to make improvements. R.E.

In R.E. we will be discussing the term 'faith' and what it means to people in a religious sense. The focus will be on the story of Abraham and children will begin to understand why he is revered by the Christian, Jewish and Muslim faiths.

Music

We will be listening to and appraising different styles of music this half-term including; pop, Mo-town, soul, and classical. We will continue our singing with Mr Roberts and making links within the community to learn songs for our visit to All Saints Church.

Art

We will be exploring different artists from the North East, such as John Coatsworth and looking at work from the pitman painters. We are using the North East as our inspiration to try out and refine our skills

<u>P.E.</u>

Year 3 children will be spending time with different coaches in school, teaching us cricket and football.
