Comic Relief Bake Off – PTFA members pitched in to organise this brilliantly supported event. All money raised went to Comic Relief, but maybe this could be something for the school next time?

An annual contribution of £50 was agreed to support the work of **Archibald Family Support**. This is in line with the donations to each class.

World Book Day – another enthusiastic event helped restock the library books.

Mary's Meals Backpack Appeal – thanks to your generous support 50 full backpacks were donated enabling 50 children in Malawi to attend school, gain an education and receive a nutritious meal each day. An additional two boxes of bits and pieces were also sent to the charity. Thanks to the Green Team for their help in sorting the donations.

All new Spring Fete – the move to a Saturday saw many more families able to come along to the event and a steady stream of arrivals. The timing also enabled parents who can't physically support weekday events to help out. And, of course, takings rose by a third! Based on this success the Spring Fete looks set to be a regular feature.

Christmas Cards – who could fail to love their young one's festive artwork?! These went down a storm with parents and their nearest and dearest.

Cake sales – baking continued to be a successful theme as the cake sales have raised an average £80 per month so far this year.

Treasurer's Report

With your support takings so far this year from PTFA events and fundraising initiatives have been over £7000. From this we have been able to raise £4250 for the school, over £2500 of which has already been gifted to the school, as highlighted below. The remainder will be put towards the new laptops and a bid for equipment from school council.

With the funds held over for the laptops from last year as agreed with the school to take advantage of bulk buying, we are delighted to be able to provide the school with 13 laptops and a new laptop trolley with a value of around £7000.

Our funding commitments this year decreased substantially as the PTFA no longer has to pay for the classroom water coolers. In addition to increased fundraising this year, this has enabled the PTFA commit to funding 13 new laptops and the new laptop trolley. An additional annual £50 of funding was agreed at a PTFA meeting for Archibald Family Support.

As you will see, there was a greatly increased fundraising effort this year which has enabled the PTFA to go a long way to achieving the IT fundraising target of 15 laptops and a laptop trolley.

Thank you for your constant support, which puts smiles on our children's faces.

I liked when we were swimming in year 3 with everyone in my class.


When I first came to this school I was scared and nervous. In year 3 our best trip was the Discovery Meusuem and I bought a bendy rubber.
