Literacy

In narrative texts the children will cover a range of scripts with emphasis on creating a TV cookery programme. In non-fiction, the focus will be on newspaper reports, magazines and leaflets. The children will also complete writing tasks linked to their work on Keeping Healthy. In speaking and listening, children will take part in drama, role - play and hot -seating activities. They will also have the opportunity to present their work to others, where appropriate, using ICT.. Including filming their written programmes. They will continue to develop phonological knowledge and increase their awareness of spelling patterns through regular phonic sessions.

Numeracy

The children continue to develop their understanding of objectives for the first half of the Autumn Term. They will add and subtract mentally pairs of two digit numbers and explain their methods orally. They should learn the multiplication facts up to 10 x 10 and be able to derive the corresponding division facts. They will be encouraged to analyse and interpret the data in tables, diagrams, tally charts, pictograms and bar charts, using ICT where appropriate. They should choose and use standard metric units and their abbreviations when estimating, measuring and recording length, weight and capacity. They will investigate shapes and their properties.
