## Literacy

In poetry, the children will look at a range of poems and will explore form. Non-fiction includes reading and writing a selection of persuasive texts. The children will also write leaflets, letters, diary extracts and reports linked to their work on the Victorians. In speaking and listening, children will take part in drama, role - play and hot -seating activities. They will also have the opportunity to present their work to others, where appropriate, using ICT. Regular phonics sessions will consolidate work covered in Year 3 and will continue to look at more complex spelling patterns and their applications.

## **Numeracy**

Children will learn how to add or subtract mentally pairs of two-digit whole numbers. They will develop and use written methods to record, support and explain multiplication and division of three-digit numbers by a one-digit number, including division with remainders. Children will continue to learn and apply multiplication and division facts up to 10 x 10. They will solve one and two-step word problems involving numbers, money or measures, including time. They will report solutions to puzzles and problems, giving explanations and reasoning orally and in writing, using diagrams and symbols.
