"Think, Feel, React" Research Study

Newcastle University are carrying out a research study called 'Think, Feel, React study'. The study aims to recruit about 40 children and young people aged between 8-16 years who have fluent language skills, a diagnosis of ASD and no other developmental conditions.

The study is part of a programme of work being carried out by the University to help identify factors that may influence the development of anxiety in young people with a diagnosis of ASD. This could provide the building blocks for creating interventions to reduce symptoms of anxiety.

They will be asking the young people to complete some assessments that are like games, so that they can investigate their thinking styles. They will also ask them to complete some questionnaires that have been designed for children. They will be asking parents to complete some questionnaires about their child too. It will take approximately 60 minutes for children and their parents to complete all of the tasks. Data collection could take place at home or at the University.

If you have a child aged between 8-16 years and you would like to take part or hear more about the study they would love to hear from you!

'Project Choice' Newcastle - Information Event



afternoon session running from 1.00pm-3.00pm.


Cost: £25.00 for a parent and child together (some sponsored places may be available)
