PE Kits

We will continue to ask the children to come into school dressed for PE on their PE days. Please check that all PE kit fits including outdoor trainers. A plain red -shirt, royal blue shoes and trainers will be needed.

If the weather is colder, a school jumper/cardigan can be worn with plain navy/black jogging bottoms. Other branded jumpers/trousers should not be worn. Thank you.

Summer Uniform

As the weather brightens, summer dresses (red checked) and navy shorts can be worn. Socks should remain plain white, red or navy. If sandals are worn, these must be plain white, navy or black, be flat and fasten securely around the ankle. Socks must be worn with sandals.

Regardless of the weather, a coat is needed everyday as the children will play outside.

Fancy hair accessories and hairbands need to be kept for weekends, thank you.
