# <u>Healthy School</u>

#### **Keystage 2 Fruit Snack**

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with a piece of fruit each day. All children in Year 3 and 4 are also encouraged to bring in a piece of fruit for breaktime; apples, bananas, tomatoes, cucumber, tangerines... It would be great if we could encourage all our children to eat more fruit every day!



#### **Drinks in school**

Water bottles should be brought into school every day. Only plain, still water must be in the bottles. Juice and flavoured water are not permitted.



#### **Balanced Packed lunches**

As a healthy school all meals prepared are balanced. We ask that parents supplying packed lunches from home consider this carefully and provide a balance of savoury and sweet along with fruit. No pop or fizzy drinks should be included. We ask that all chocolate spread, sweets / confectionary are kept for treats at home. No nuts (including Nutella) please!

We are sure that you agree that table manners are very important and how we eat at school should be the same as at home and when eating out. Please support us in ensuring your children use a knife and fork to eat their meals, can cut up their food and will eat with super table manners.



#### <u>Headlice</u>

Please check your children's hair over the weekend for headlice. It is the perfect time to treat them and fit in a second treatment at the end of next week to make sure any eggs have also gone.



## No Mud Please!

As the grass is now wet and muddy, please stay off the adventure playground before and after school. This keeps you safe from slipping, your shoes and clothes clean from mud, and the school carpets spotless!

## <u>Equipment</u>

Please do NOT allow your children to climb up the red goals – these are going get broken. Any equipment in the Nursery yard should also be left alone at the start and end of the day.


In the past we might have taken our green spaces for granted, but inspired by how much we relied on them during lockdown communities across the country are coming together to make their local communities that bit better.

- . Clingfilm
- . Foil
- Individual juice cartons or bottles
- Plastic cutlery
- Individually wrapped snacks













#### Say YES to ...

- Multi compartment lunch boxes OR mini reusable plastic boxes to stop individual wrapping!
- Buy in bulk (packets of biscuits, large pack of raisins, blocks of cheese, individual carrots). Chop/slice and pop in the reusable containers or compartments to stop the use of foil and cling film, and reduce rubbish.
- Metal cutlery
- Reusable water bottles—no more one use cartons and bottles!
- Reusable sandwich bags or beeswax wrapping.
