

In addition:



- We still have cases of Covid in school and in our family homes.
- Opening the school up to a wider number of parents could mean that we spread cases and ruin people's half-term holidays. We know that some of our families did not have a positive Christmas holiday due to Covid and would hate for this to happen again.
- We have parents and staff who are clinically vulnerable, some undergoing treatment etc. Understandably, we have a duty of care to these people.
- Asking the younger year group to watch the class assembly is important to us. We want the children to enjoy positive experiences (as well as the adults) and inviting them along to the assembly allows them to have an insight into the next year group and an opportunity to feel special too.

As you will appreciate, everything is a balance. We hope that parents can look for the positives and celebrate the steps that we are taking.



Archibald First School has just officially pledged to become a School of Sanctuary @SchsofSanctuary. We are committed to being a place of solidarity, compassion & welcome for all.


This is only the first step in the process for us, so watch this space for further updates.

Consultation: Uniform September 2022:

PE Hoodies/T-Shirts and Branded Jumper or Cardigan

As we renew our Uniform Policy for 2022, we would like to inform you of two changes we anticipate making. If you have any comments about this, then please do send them in to admin@archibald.newcastle.sch.uk by 1.4.22.

T-shirts, shirts, trousers, skirts, shorts and summer dresses will remain the same with these items able to be purchased from any high street store or supermarket.

The items that we will expect to be branded with the school logo are the school jumper/cardigan, PE t-shirt and our new PE Hoodie (optional). We are planning to introduce a PE hoodie for Reception to Year 4 to be worn on PE days only, as of September 2022. Having these items branded will ensure that all the children are shown to be representing the school at all times e.g. educational visits, PE competitions etc.

Year 4 Times Tables Check

All children in Year 4 have to complete a statutory Times Table check in June. This check is to test all multiplication tables up to 12×12 . The children are tested on their rapid recall of these number facts using an online system, where the children use either a computer screen or a tablet.

There are two brilliant applications which directly replicates the format of the times tables check which our Key Stage 2 children, particularly in Year 4, could use over the next few months as additional practice. 




Last week, each year group celebrated **Safer Internet Day** and revisited key Digital Literacy messages. Take a look at their new displays in our computing suite...













Nursery Applications

We currently have one space for Nursery 2, for children who turned 3 on or before 31st August 2021. Archibald First School offers 15 hours of free nursery provision to children who are aged 3 on or before 31st August 2022. The hours are offered as either Option 1 or Option 2. We also offer Option 3* (full time) for 30 hours per week.

Option 1:

Monday 8.45 — 3.15 Tuesday 8.45 — 3.15 Wednesday 8.45 — 11.30

Option 2:

Wednesday 12.30 — 3.15 Thursday 8.45 — 3.15 Friday 8.45 — 3.15 **Option 3*** – 30 hours per week: Daily, Monday to Friday: 8.45 – 3.15
