<u>Literacy</u>

The children will continue daily phonics and spelling lessons, revising all the Year 2 common exception words. They will use the text 'Who Swallowed Stanley?' to develop skills in story writing and sentence structure. They will continue work on similes in their writing and use this to write poetry inspired by the ocean and weather. Handwriting continues to be a focus and we are encouraging the children to use joins as and when they feel ready to. In grammar lessons, we will continue to develop skills in using the apostrophe, alphabetical order, commas in lists and subordination and coordination.

<u>Numeracy</u>

As it is the final term of Year 2, the children will revise all main concepts including addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. They will also have time to recap money, time, shape and measure.

Continued practise on times tables and number bonds to 100 will help develop their mental arithmetic strategies.

The focus for new learning this term will be statistics: tally charts , tables , pictograms and bar charts. The children will learn how to read ,draw and interpret data. We will also study Time ; learning o'clock, half past, quarter past and to and recognising five minute intervals.

PE Having fun, keeping healthy and learning new skills...

Our PE units will be Athletics and Target Games. In Athletics, we will develop skills such as running at different speeds, jumping and throwing. We will engage in performing skills and measuring performance, competing to improve on our own score s. Target games are games where players send an object towards a target. We will develop our understanding of defending and attacking as well as throwing, rolling and striking towards a target .

PSHE Living in the Wider World

The children will be learning about their physical health and mental wellbeing, and how they grow and change and become more independent. They will learn about safety near water.

<u>RE</u>

We will be continuing our work on Islam. Learning about the features of a Mosque, the Qur'an and the Five Pillars of Islam.

Music Listening, appreciating, interpreting, playing, develop-

Computing

This half-term in Computing, we will be learning how to conduct our own research using search engines and websites, whilst keeping ourselves safe online.

Science

In Science, we are learning about plants. We will learn about the parts of a plant, labelling key vocabulary on diagrams. We will also be observing and describing how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants. Finally, we will investigate and describe what plants need to grow and stay healthy.

Art/Design Technology

In Art, we have lots of exciting learning planned! Our first day back will be 'sculpture day', where Year 2 will be looking at the work of Gaudi and using clay and tiles to create their own mosaics. Then, we will be reading 'Katie and the Water Lilies', looking at the work of Monet and taking inspiration from our Forest School space to create our own paintings.

Humanities / PSHE

The final Humanities topic has an ecological focus, the children will find out about the effects of pollution to the oceans over time.

They will investigate how the ocean has changed due to a higher demand for fishing and that the amount of plastic in the ocean has increased greatly over the last century. The idea that the actions of humans now has an effect on the future will help the children develop a sense of stewardship in becoming the planet protectors of the future.

Refugee week

The whole school will take part in Refugee week from 10th-14th June. We will be exploring what 'Home' means to us and learning what the term Refugee means.

Year 2 will read the book 'Saving the Butterfly' by Helen Cooper, a moving and symbolic story of hope and the power of the human spirit.

Throughout the week, the children will work on activities which promote our school values of being kind , caring , welcoming and empathetic to others.

We will create our own kittiwakes, to contribute to a joint display at Newcastle Library. The kittiwake bird symbolises migration and sanctuary here in Newcastle.
