Please do not send Christmas cards into school. Let's keep the trees, reduce our carbon footprint & save some pennies.




Christmas Thanks

Contacting School



Strong relationships between home and school are important to us at Archibald. We value all feedback and hope that we can use it to continue to improve the school and provide the best experience for your child.

If you do have any suggestions, comments, questions or queries please do not hesitate to make contact with the staff when these arise: there is no need to wait until a parent's evening or an open afternoon.

We understand that often due to work commitments it may not always be possible for you to speak to a member of staff at the beginning or end of the school day. The staff are all very approachable and would be happy to speak to you on the telephone at these times or to make a mutually convenient appointment to meet in person.

Points of Contact

In the majority of cases, the first point of contact would be your child's class teacher.

We also have three senior members of staff within the school who lead the different age phases. These are Mrs McNally for the Early Years Foundation Stage, Mrs Howard for Key Stage 1 (years 1 and 2) and Mrs Graham for Key Stage 2 (years 3 and 4).

As Mrs Howard is on maternity leave, Mrs Sinclair is our current Key Stage 1 leader.

Mrs Ward in her role as Special Educational Needs and Disability Leader is also a point of contact.

Mrs Mullick as Deputy Headteacher and Mrs Turner, as Head Teacher, are also available.

Parent Governor Vacancy

Archibald is still looking for a parent/carer governor to join the governing body as of the autumn term 2024.

The role is about the school as a whole and the entire school community.

School welcomes and encourages applications for the position of parent governor from everyone. It is very important to us that our whole school community is represented on our Governing Body.



Did you know that no experience, education qualifications or specific backgrounds are required?

The only essential we ask for is parents/carers who are dedicated to the role of being a parent governor and who are in a position to firmly commit to the regular meetings across the year held at 5.30-7.30pm (between 4-10 meetings) and to coming into school at least 3 times per year.

The role involves being a critical friend — offering a clear balance of support, challenge, vision and accountability.

Anti-Bullying Information

What do we do to prevent bullying?

At Archibald First School, we work hard to prevent bullying occurring in the first place. Our school rules place respect, responsibility and safety at the heart of our school environment. We take part annually in the Anti-Bullying programme and have embedded behaviour, friendship and antibullying into our year-round curriculum provision.

We are a listening school, in which children are encouraged to express their feelings, fears and concerns. This is facilitated through PSHE Curriculum, Assemblies, class discussion time and role play.

We include everybody and celebrate difference through our assemblies, No Outsiders curriculum, RE curriculum, specific religious celebration 'days' and through the wider curriculum enhancement.

We promote and reward positive behaviour, celebrate achievements and develop whole school and class rules — as highlighted in our Behaviour Policy — and challenge negative language or behaviours in response to an incident. We respond as a whole school to negative behaviours through assemblies, or whole-school focused topics, to enable our school to continually evolve.

We provide a positive learning environment and educate children, parents and staff so that all members of the school community are hopefully confident enough to report bullying and know how to do so.

All staff members are trained and the pupils are regularly briefed on what bullying is, in order that the whole school community understands what bullying is and what it isn't.

We encourage the feeling of 'belonging' to a community and use peer group pressure to actively discourage bullying, especially through our work on the role of the 'Defender'.

We respect each other with careful consideration of how adults in school talk to children and children know that they will be believed by staff, should they need to report a bullying incident.

We take action and respond to all incidents quickly. We use CPOMS (electronic recording system) to record incidents, to ensure that all relevant staff members are aware and can take appropriate action.

We have a clear policy in place that is shared annually with children, but reinforced termly.

We have a school council to encourage children to have a voice.

We use Tweet Boxes in classrooms and key adults for children who are particularly vulnerable

We run Anti-Bullying Week annually and follow this up with throughout the year.
